**Ambassador Samantha Power** is the Anna Lindh Professor of the Practice of Global Leadership and Public Policy at Harvard Kennedy School and the William D. Zabel '61 Professor of Practice in Human Rights at Harvard Law School. From 2013 to 2017 Power served as the 28th U.S. Permanent Representative to the United Nations, as well as a member of President Obama's cabinet. In this role, Power became the public face of U.S. opposition to Russian aggression in Ukraine and Syria, negotiated the toughest sanctions in a generation against North Korea, lobbied to secure the release of political prisoners, helped build new international law to cripple ISIL's financial networks, and supported President Obama's pathbreaking actions to end the Ebola crisis. President Obama has called her "one of our foremost thinkers on foreign policy," saying that "she showed us that the international community has a moral responsibility and a profound interest in resolving conflicts and defending human dignity."

From 2009 to 2013, Power served on the National Security Council as Special Assistant to the President and Senior Director for Multilateral Affairs and Human Rights, where she focused on issues including atrocity prevention; UN reform; LGBT and women's rights; the promotion of religious freedom and the protection of religious minorities; and the prevention of human trafficking.

Called by *Forbes* "a powerful crusader for U.S. foreign policy as well as human rights and democracy," Ambassador Power has been named one of *TIME's* "100 Most Influential People" and one of *Foreign Policy's* "Top 100 Global Thinkers."

Power has been recognized as a leading voice internationally for principled American engagement in the world. Her book "*A Problem from Hell: America and the Age of Genocide*" won the Pulitzer Prize and the National Book Critics Circle Award in 2003.
