### **Guest Columnist**

TNWAC's summer break will end on Wednesday, August 20 at the offices of Holland & Knight with a lecture by Nonresident Senior Fellow at the <u>Atlantic Council</u> Dexter Tiff Roberts, who will deliver his take on China's Push for Superpower Status in a World in Turmoil. As the Trump Administration focuses on a more narrow, less multilateral, and pre-World War 2 definition of America's national interest, many experts suspect that our principal rival, the People's Republic of China, will move to fill in an America-sized void.

Furthermore, TNWAC will be hosting two online webinar near the end of August, the first discussing the Greenland and the Geopolitics of the Arctic, a clearly hot topic in the news these days as President Trump has refused to rule out <u>military force</u> against the vast but sparsely-populated Danish island, and another about Olympics and the geopolitics of global sport.

On September 10 TNWAC will present a webinar with two renowned Polish experts on Russia and Ukraine from the Polish Institute of Eastern Studies (OSW), Tadeusz Iwanski and Witold Rodkiewicz, on the Polish perspective of the War in Ukraine. Since Poland and Ukraine have shared centuries of a highly complex relationship, I believe it is vital to understand the perspective of Ukraine's most critical western neighbor.

Shortly after I returned from Poland in June, the Polish people delivered a shock electoral outcome, handing the Polish presidency to little-known historian and amateur boxer Karol Nawrocki over the haute-monde Mayor of Warsaw Rafal Trzaskowski. On my blog cheekily entitled Waitt, What you can read my <u>assessment</u> of how Nawrocki pulled off this stunning upset and subscribe to several other entertaining articles about geopolitics penned by yours truly. Happy August everyone!
